

# **Special Feature - Part One**

Notes by George Charlton

I was going through Lions' bulletins from the 1960s that Shirley Howden gave to the Tuatapere Lions' Club after Bill's passing and, on doing some research on the ambulance, came across this article on Doctor Elder, who was also a member of the Tuatapere Lions' Club.



Article on Dr Elder as recorded in Lions' Club Bulletin 21st November 1967

Bulletin 5: 21st November 1967

Profile Report: Doctor Eric Elder

Born in Aberdeen, Scotland in 1913 Eric's family moved to New Zealand in 1920 and settled in Dunedin where his father, John R Elder LLD, held the first Chair in History at Otago University. Eric attended Maori Hill School and was awarded Dux in 1925. He went on to John McGlashon College for his secondary education. His record at McGlashon was impressive. In 1927 he won a senior national scholarship, in 1929 he won a university junior scholarship and was Dux of the school. 1930 saw him again Dux and also first in New Zealand for the University Scholarship. From high school Eric moved to Otago University and undertook the study of Medicine. Whilst he was at university he was editor of the university Critic—the University Review and in 1936 he was editor of the Capping Book. Qualifying as a doctor in 1936 Eric spent two years at Dunedin Hospital, leaving there in 1938 for Tuatapere, where he has been in practice ever since.

Some of Dr Elder's Accomplishments:

Diploma of Obstetrics 1946; Doris Gorton Scholar 1963; On NZ Board of Censors for the British General Practitioners 1967

Dr Elder's Outside Interests:

Included in some of Dr Elder's many interests were his position as Past President of the Tuatapere Axemen's Association and the Southland Axemen's Association. He was Chairman of the Tuatapere Domain Board and a member of the Country Town Committee. Doctor Elder was Patron of the Tuatapere Piping and Dancing Association and the Waiau Community Arts. No mean sportsman in his day he was interested in tennis, cricket, badminton and golf.

On October 12th 1967 Eric and his wife Lillian celebrated 25 years of marriage (kept fairly quiet). Another Doctor entered the family on December 15th 1967 when daughter Elizabeth wed her Doctor of Science. Son Christopher is working towards his MA and is showing interest and ability in the literary field. Safe to say that this report is not likely to be duplicated by any other member of this club!

# PERSON OF INTEREST

# Where are you from? Where are you now?

I was born in Otautau in 1940. When I was 4 years old we moved to Pukemaori and I went to Waiau District High School.

I'm retired now and have been in Invercargill for about three and half years. I play indoor bowls to keep active - My wife and I played indoor bowls with great success. I used to play for the Tuatapere Bowling Club and was made a Life Member which I greatly appreciated. I also do crossword puzzles to keep my mind active too.

# When you lived in Tuatapere, what did you do?

When I was 14 (and still going to school) I used to do slaughtering after school. I'd be shooting and skinning the animals. The slaughter house is still standing – you can see it as you head out of Tuatapere. I was quite often tired at school of course, and I'd fall asleep at my desk alot. The teacher would wake me up at about 10 to 5 – just in time to get to work. When I left school I went to work in the local butchery for a Mr Joe Prendeville. And I still went slaughtering after I finished work too!

When I was a lad, you would find me down at the rugby every Saturday during the season. I played No #8 on the side of the scrum. I was Captain of the Waiau Star Junior Rugby Team. When I was 15 years old we played 8 games and won every single one, ending the season with 200 points. Still have a love of rugby to this day!

I did eventually buy the Butcher's Shop. With my former business partner, Len Kitto we came up with the Tuatapere Sausages recipe in the 1980s. Up until then we had been making sausages from the previous butcher shop owner's recipe. We decided they needed more meat and less fat and we worked on it, and got what we got. We named them Tuatapere Sausages. They sold all around the country and their popularity soared locally when the sausages were judged the favourite sausage in Southland in a competition run by the Radio personality Phil Denton. We polled 82% of the vote! I sold the butcher shop in 2003 and moved to Bridge Street.

# What would people remember the most about you?

The famous Tuatapere Sausages of course. It's a secret recipe that has been passed on, but most sausage makers don't seem to want to follow it – they want to put their own spin on the recipe. That's ok but of course it's not the same. The key is simple really – less fat, more meat makes a decent sausage!

# What's the best thing about Tuatapere?

In my view, the best thing about Tuatapere is that it's a close-knit community. Most people are really friendly and there to help one another.

# What's the funniest/weirdest thing that happened to you while you lived here?

When I was young I had a horse and cart – used to call it Bones and Crackle. The horse used to bolt and get into a gallop when you got close to home. I'd be swinging on the reins. One day someone had closed the gate (it was always open) and the horse did it's thing when we got closer to home – except it didn't know the gate was closed. Well you can imagine the rest of the story – there was no gate left that's for sure!

# A Piece of History

### THE LEGEND OF DIDO NICHOLAS

Dido Nicholas was a born-again swimmer Perhaps the finest that Southland has seen And tho' he lived more than a century ago His heroic exploits hold a permanent sheen

Dido grew up in a good Colac Bay family His father both teacher and linguist of note Who also supported the Temperance Union But for Dido, the booze was life's antidote

Dido had no fear of the great Waiau River He could conquer its swiftness inebriated He occasionally crossed it stone-cold sober But one swim for drink was long celebrated

One Saturday night Dido arrived into town With his 'watering hole' on the farther side Already tanked up but needing more grog He called once again on prowess and pride

Just half-way across, pure exhaustion set in With visions of joining some after-life fold Thus Dido implored at the depths of despair God, please just give me something to hold

He struggled on gamely, prayer unanswered Still banishing thoughts of a mortuary shelf Then a hanging branch brushed Dido's face Don't worry God, I found something myself Based on an original story told by Allen Templeton in his book, Southwest Sawmills. Dido Nickless from Colac Bay made his most famous swim some time prior to the new Waiau Hotel being established on the east bank in 1910.

Real name Arthur Augustine Nickless, 'Dido' was born at Picton c1873 but spent most of his life at Colac Bay, where his father was head teacher. He had several brothers and sisters, including Fanny Nickless, who was a teacher at Papatotara 1898-1900. Dido enlisted for service in World War I and served with the New Zealand Rifle Brigade (Service No. 13079) for two years before being invalided home in December 1916. He died on 8 June 1941 after attending a sports meeting at Colac Bay. He had returned to his home at Wakapatu by train that evening and died suddenly, just prior to reaching the house, where he was found the following morning. He was given a military funeral and later interred at the Riverton cemetery.



# Chaplain's Chat

"I believe that people have different ways of apologising; what one person considers a sincere apology is not what another person may consider a sincere apology. In essence they have different languages of apology". Dr Jennifer Thomas

If you're human there will have been times when you have been hurt by the words or actions of someone else, and also have very likely hurt others. Some of these offences are minor, like accidentally bumping into someone as you walk down the road – chances are a quick acknowledgement and "I'm sorry" is all that is required. Other situations are much more hurtful and damaging to our relationships. Yet I never ceased to be amazed by the stories of individuals and communities that reconcile and heal even after the most horrific offences.

Focusing on the day-to-day though, the ability to apologise and forgive is fundamental to our own wellbeing and the health of our relationships. The flow-on effects can be significant.

Like love, apologies can be described as having five aspects or "languages". As with the love languages, one or two of the aspects will speak more clearly to you as to the sincerity of an apology.

**Expressing Regret** – we usually do this through the simple words "I'm sorry". This can be made more meaningful by being specific and without condition. For some people hearing those words is really important.

**Accepting Responsibility** – while for some it is hard to say "I was wrong to do that" is difficult, for others it is an absolute necessity to hear them in an apology. To admit we were wrong takes courage and maturity, but has the potential to bring hope and healing to a relationship.

**Making Restitution** – this "language" asks the question, "what can I do to show you that I want to put things right between us?" The act of restitution is likely to be even more effective if expressed in the love language of the offended person.

**Genuinely Repenting** – to repent is to simply turn around or change one's mind in order to act differently in the future – to not do "it" again. This could begin with an expressed intent to change and then developing a plan to bring about the change.

As part of an apology some people need to hear the words, "will you forgive me?" These words show an admission of guilt, express the value of the relationship and empower the person who has been hurt. Forgiveness cannot be demanded, it is essentially a gift.

As always, much more could be said, but I invite you to think about this next time you're faced with having to apologise – if you're like me it'll be sooner than you think! Feel free to be in touch anytime.



# Pioneer Families of the Waiau Valley

Many thanks to Malcolm Garrett for these records (and thanks to Margaret Thomas who has given us access to them so that we can share them with you). We hope you enjoy Pioneer Families of the Waiau Valley!

### **About the Initial Project**

Pioneer Ancestors of Waiau Valley was a local history project for the Tuatapere Information Centre. An effort was being made to record the lives and times of our local pioneering families and the contributions they had made to our present district. The areas included Waiau Valley from Papatotara to Blackmount and over as far as Merrivale and down to Te Wae Wae and Orepuki.

To keep the project within a scope, the investigations were kept to those who had descendants still living in the area. An arrival date limit of before WWII was made to help keep the project practical as well.

# Mrs W. Bradley--nee Minnie Eliza Russon. 17th August 1861- 2nd April 1937.

Born in the leather town of Walsall, Staffs. England, the eldest child of a boot and shoemaker, Minnie Eliza spent her childhood in London and her early womanhood in Melbourne and West Gippsland, Victoria, Australia, where she married Wm Bradley who had come as a child from Newcastle on Tyne, England, to Victoria in 1854.

December 1882 with their eldest child Richard W.R [Dick] b. 1880, she arrived at Belmont Station via Hobart and The Bluff and a two day journey by bullock wagon from Otautau. Wm had been engaged as a shepherd at 80 pounds a year.

She was small and dark and 21 years old. Without a doctor or a telephone five more children were born and reared " in the old station " -: Ewen A.1883, Bertram V. 1885, James W. 1890, Margaret C. 1891 and Minnie E. 1893. Education was a problem, but all received some formal schooling and were kept up-to-date in world events.

When Belmont Station was "cut up" in the early 1890's Wm acquired the homestead block and in 1900 "The Old Homestead" was abandoned and the new home known as Mangapiri established in the open country out from "the Takis". In 1916 they bought their first motor-carabuick tourer which was later replaced by the heavy sedan Silver Anniversary model. Both cars were only driven by Miss Margaret Bradley.

Mangapiri was never a sophisticated home, but it was where all who had an association with the district returned to pay a social call or to holiday, and where latterly the Pres. Church's Orawia Home missionary conducted a monthly Sunday service after which M.E.B. rose from her chair by the fireside and said, "You'll all stay for a cup of tea". She was now very stout and confined mostly to sitting, but under Margaret the home was running smoothly, as did the farmwork under Bert.

When she died in 1937 and was buried in Otautau New Cemetery 16 years after her husband, she was remembered as kindly, efficient and hospitable.






