
The bouncy Castle will hopefully be in the RSA Hall, the Merry Go Round will be there ALL rides are FREE!!!!!

Great to see Stewart Island getting a couple of wind generators, hopefully this will encourage industry to settle back on the Island and create employment and future prosperity.


The launch of the Great South projects was held last week of which I attended.

#### Tuatapere Police Report for November 2019

The school year is pretty much done with the kids heading off on holidays. As December starts there will be the normal round of end of year functions where alcohol features. Please ensure you take the necessary steps to ensure you have designated sober drivers organised.

At the very end of October which did not make it into last month's report Police had to respond to a man who was lost and disorientated for about three days in the bush up the Groveburn area. The man who was an Indian national travelling in NZ was ill prepared and almost hypothermic. He was very fortunate that some hunters located him and brought him out to Police where he was able to be get help. In another search and rescue type matter in November Police had to respond to an overdue boat that had not returned from Lake Monowai. The situation ended happily but the boat owner got into trouble following the weather turning rough with very high winds. High waves swamped the boat tied to the shore edge while the owner was hunting near the top of the lake. Following the weather easing the owner was able to remove the water and get underway despite some damage.

Police have responded to three different domestic altercations during the month, no offences were disclosed and Police attendance was sufficient to resolve the situation on the day. Often we see challenges in relationships where things have been building for some time. We would encourage people to take proactive steps to engage with support services such as relationship counselling or other support people. They are ideally placed to provide guidance on how to work through things before matters get out of control.

Police responded to a threatening behaviour incident at a rural location near Tuatapere which resulted in a number of staff from surrounding Police Stations attending. A local man was arrested for threatening behaviour, possession of cannabis and possession of a firearm with no licence.

Police are investigating the graffiti of a house garage where offenders spray painted an offensive message on the building. A Police response was also required at a couple of disorder related incidents at Tuatapere. A farm on the edge of Tuatapere suffered some damage to a locked farm gate and the offender has then entered the farm leaving gates open. This type of behaviour is unacceptable, Police will prosecute anyone caught unlawfully on property in this manner. Police executed a search and seizure of a vehicle located near Clifden after its involvement in an incident in the Ohai Nightcaps area.

There has been one non injury crash that Police have responded to which occurred after a vehicle left the road just south of Tuatapere going over a bank and rolling into a farm paddock. In other driving related matters Police were involved in a pursuit which started in Tuatapere township near the Four Square. The male who was identified by Police was a known disqualified driver and drove like an idiot to the point that Police abandoned the pursuit to avoid innocent members of the public being put at risk. The vehicle was later discovered abandoned at the Clifden suspension bridge and impounded. Driver is yet to be located and will be facing a number of court charges in due course. Separately to this there have been reports of youths riding motorbikes in the township on the road and footpaths. As parents it is not acceptable to allow your children to ride or use motorbikes or any vehicle on a roadway if they have no licence. The correct place for having a bit of fun is out in a farm paddock somewhere.

There have been a couple of items of lost property reported to the Police should you come across them. Somewhere in or near Tuatapere an orange camo hunting bag containing camo hunting jacket, cannon camera black, black go pro hero "s", blue UE mega boom, rifle bolt, hunting knife, head lamp and set of head phones was lost. In the Garden Bay area of Orepuki an Iphone was lost. If you come across these or any other lost property, you can hand it into the Police Station so we can get it back to the owners. While it may be tempting to keep found items as a bit of a freebie it is actually theft to hold onto property that does not belong to you and there is a reasonable prospect of its owner being located. The correct course of action is to hand it in to Police. If the owner can't be located, in most cases as the finder of the property you can then claim it after a reasonable period of time has lapsed.

#### Hauroko Valley Primary and Waiau Area School - Bus Network Route Review

This report is to provide an opportunity to update the community on the recent school bus network route review that was undertaken by the Ministry of Education involving both Hauroko Valley Primary and Waiau Area School. This review was completed in October 2019 and has now been finalised which will see some changes commencing at the start of the 2020 school year.

Due to the close proximity of both schools and the cross over with high school students needing to access Waiau Area School. The school buses which are run by Brazier Motors (Dan and Leigh), contracted by the Ministry of Education, operate a joint bus service to both schools.

The community will no doubt have seen some of the recent media articles around changes to Central Southland College where a number of bus routes have been cut following the Ministry undertaking a network route review. The process that Hauroko and Waiau have gone through is exactly the same. The Ministry has a clear Bus Entitlement Policy, which it overlays across the school zone known as a Transport Entitlement Zone (TEZ) and then cross checks that against eligible children within the zone to ensure that its buses are providing the best service within the rules required under the policy. As an example, the school can only ask for an extension to an existing route if it has at least four further children past the end of the bus route or up a side road. A new route can only be applied for if you have at least 8 children needing access to the school who live within the zone. We are not allowed to factor in children who live outside our zone and travel to our schools, in terms of applying for a bus, to go beyond the last family within the school zone. The buses are not permitted to travel outside your school zone.

The Principals and Board of Trustee Chairs from both Hauroko and Waiau have worked together closely with the Ministry of Education since the middle of the year to advocate for the best school bus service we can provide within the Ministry rules that need to be followed.

While there will be a few changes particularly on the Orepuki bus route due to families moving on seeing the bus stopping a couple of kilometres short of the Orepuki township, Overall we are very positive about the improvements we have been able to achieve. Some significant gains include the establishment of a new bus route from Waiau Area School through to Hauroko Valley Primary and right up to Blackmount ending at the Blackmount School, to date there has been only a community van operated by the Blackmount community driven by parents going to Hauroko. This provides both a Primary and High School bus service for the Blackmount community. The Lillburn Valley bus run will now travel a further 3km up the valley ending at the Dean Forest Road. This same bus will now also operate a new extension up the Lillburn-Monowai road through the gorge into the Motu Valley providing a bus service for those families which have had no school bus service for many years. The current Feldwick bus run which has only gone as far as Hauroko will now also travel through to Waiau providing a high school bus service for families in that area.

We will continue to work actively with the Ministry to enhance our school bus network across our zones, with the vision of seeing an equitable bus service for every community, within each schools' home zone. While the network has been improved significantly we still have a few locations that we want to see improvements achieved as new families enrol and bus route extensions can be applied for. Orepuki being one area for Waiau, along with Merivale and the Scotts Gap basin for Waiau in terms of high school.

The school bus route review process has been a positive example of the ability of both the local schools to work together to achieve improvements for the families within the district. If you have any questions around the bus routes for 2020 please contact your respective schools.
