It must improve shortly with a bit of luck On the local scene all is fairly quiet, with work on footpaths and general maintenance progressing steadily.

On the council side we had a very good opening of stage one of the around the mountain cycle trail at Lumsden on 1/11/14 with over 1000 people in attendance. We are anticipating that this venture will bring a much needed boost to the people and small businesses in the area and a flow on effect to the rest of rural Southland. We have had some negative feedback to this project but I cannot recall when I have last seen some of this group at any sort of a working bee or assisting in community ventures.

After 67 years of tuition Valmai has bid farewell and is now enjoying a well earned retirement. We thank Valmai and her family for the commitment over these years - Well done.

Update from Waiau Health Tuatapere St John Ambulance, *And what it means to us*

We would like to take a moment to recognise and thank the St John ambulance volunteers. We are so pleased to see recent interest from people to become volunteers, this really makes a difference and is a really good start to make the service more sustainable.

Having a well crewed ambulance service in Tuatapere is vitally important to Waiau Health Trust for many reasons. One of the key issues for us when thinking about our ambulance service is about having and retaining professional clinicians in Tuatapere and helping them feel safe in their practice.

One of the first questions we encounter when interviewing GP's is "Where is the nearest ambulance". This is important because a practitioner wants to know they can quickly and safely transport a patient if the need arises. Of course when we inform applicants we have an ambulance based right here in Tuatapere, this is very well received. In a country where there are 45 permanent rural GP vacancies this might just be the decider on whether a GP comes to us or goes elsewhere. Lack of services is a deal breaker, and when we are having these discussions we are very thankful to have the services that we have.

Another important consideration is having an ambulance available for the Tuatapere Maternity Hospital. Birthing is a natural and safe life event, yet like anything in life things can occasionally go wrong. When birthing at our Maternity Facility you can be sure you will be well cared for by a team of professional midwives, nurses and carers. Those professionals must be reassured they have the back up of a reliable ambulance. This is part of what helps them feel safe in their own practice. This is a very reasonable expectation of any clinician, and is consistent wherever you go.

Cast your mind back, less than a year, and you might remember the Lumsden maternity facility closing briefly, followed by a very uncertain period. The main issue faced at Lumsden was around ability to staff the unit and provide adequate nurse and midwife cover. The staff at that time stated they did not feel safe practicing, as the ambulance based in Lumsden was poorly staffed and seldom available. That community almost lost their Maternity Hospital as a result, and the future there is still uncertain.

So every day we are grateful to the people who give so much of their time as Ambulance Volunteers. We also give thanks to the Lions Club volunteers for their financial backing for this service.

We strongly urge anyone considering becoming involved to do so. Perhaps there is some way you could offer to help that does not involve becoming an ambulance officer, but of course if you would like to be an ambulance officer I am sure Shona and Don would love to hear from you! Graham's Police Report

TUATAPERE POLICE REPORT

Round up for October

October has seen an increase in dishonesty offences in and around Tuatapere. At the end of October a red and white Honda CRF 450R motorbike was stolen from the section of an address in Scott Street. Also in late October two unlocked vehicles were entered and some cash stolen from a property on Groveburn road. In mid October five cribs situated at Fishing Camp Road were broken into but nothing stolen however damage was caused to the various cribs when entry was forced.

An investigation is currently underway into the lighting of fires in the Public Toilets on Main Road Tuatapere. These have been targeted on two separate occassions. More by good luck than the actions of the offenders they have not caught fire and the toilets seriously damaged or destroyed.

Four separate addresses had their letter boxes damaged between the 27 and the 31st of October in the Clifden area. There have also been reports of recent poaching activity involving spotlighting in the Lillburn valley.

Police were called to the Garden Bay area after an altercation around whitebaiting. Another whitebaiter was dealt with at the Waiau River mouth after being located breaching the regulations and the matter was referred to the Department of Conservation.

Tuatapere Police were involved in two vehicle pursuits during the month in the Tuatapere area, the first related to an individual who had outstanding arrest warrants which subsequently led to a search of an address on the Lillburn Monowai Road with the assistance of the Armed Offenders Squad, the wanted man was not located at the time but has subsequently been arrested in Invercargill. A second vehicle pursuit was commenced by Riverton Police and went through Tuatapere before the driver eventually evaded Police in the vicinity of Nightcaps. The vehicle was later located hidden at an address at Nightcaps and impounded. The alledged driver of the pursuit was involved in a further pursuit about two weeks later in Christchurch where he was apprehended and is now facing a number of driving and drug related charges.

Police have dealt with three non injury vehicle crashes during the month, one involving some Chinese tourists who failed to negotiate a corner by Devery Road crashing through a fence. A truck and trailer unit failed to negotiate a corner on Reilly road, Orepuki resulting in the trailer unit rolling off the road and down a bank. The third incident involved some escaped calves causing a single vehicle crash during the hours of darkness on SH99 on the outskirts of Orepuki.

Several people have been prosecuted for various driving offences around the area, one person has been charged with driving while disqualified and another with driving after having previously been forbidden to drive. A Tuatapere youth has been referred to Police Youth Aid Services after driving dangerously outside the Tuatapere 4 Square. Two further people failed alcohol testing procedures after being stopped while driving.

With the increase in dishonesty offending if people can be alert to suspicious activity and also take steps to minimise the risk to their property by ensuring it is secured adequately.





Some of the old-timers may remember Joe Henderson who was the Lake Hauroko Hermit from about 1940 to 1960. Joe lost an arm in a hunting accident in 1932 but the WW1 veteran could shoot one-handed and row onehanded and he retired to the Fiordland bush to be a deerstalker and possum trapper. At Lake Hauroko he built a bunkhouse, a cookhouse and a wigwam

The other hermit was Rudi Ossika, a Pole, born in 1926. Fleeing trouble in post-war Europe, Rudi worked on the Snowy Mountain Power Scheme in Australia and on construction sites in the South Island. Becoming a hermit, he lived in an isolated hut near the Waikoau River. After a dispute with local farmers he moved to Auckland but later returned to camp in the Rowallan Forest where he shot himself in 1982 and his story is told in the Tuatapere Bushman's museum.

Rudi's story is probably typical of many a man with a fine work record but beset by financial or family problems or just a huge desire to get away from the noise and hassle of the world. We all feel like that at times and a good day's activity in the Fiordland bush is heartening, whether you are hunting, hiking, boating or picknicking. Any other Fiordland hermits with a story?
